

The Feasts of the Virgin Mary

The Annunciation of her Birth (7 Misra)

The angel of God announced the birth of Saint Mary to her father, Joachim. He and his wife were filled with joy and promised their daughter to the Lord.

Her Entry into the Temple

This is celebrated by the Church on the 3rd of Kiahk; it is the day on which she entered to worship in the temple, in a place especially for virgins. Saint Mary was 3 years old.

the departure of Saint Mary

This commemoration is on 21st of Touba. The Church also commemorates the miracle which occurred on that day. The disciples surrounded her, except for Saint Thomas who was preaching in India.

The monthly feast of Saint Mary

This is on the 21st day of each Coptic month and commemorates her passing on 21 Touba.

Her entry into Egypt with our Lord Jesus Christ

This is celebrated by the Church on 24 Bashans. This is one of the feasts of our Lord, but we consider that Saint Mary was associated with it because of her presence with Him.

The Birth of Saint Mary

The Church celebrates this event on 1 Bashans

The feast of her miracle

This is on 21 Baouna, and we commemorate the miracle performed by the Virgin for St. Matthias the Apostle. It is also the building of the first church in the name of the Holy Virgin in Philippi.

The Assumption of her body

The Church celebrates this occasion on **16 Misra**. This feast marks the end of the fast of the Virgin Mary which lasts for two weeks.

Her appearance at El- Zeitoun

This occurred on April 2, 1968 (24 Baramhat) and continued many times. In addition to all this, we celebrate for the whole month of Kiahk with praise, honoring Saint Mary


I was ordained on February 16th 1997

Church Saints

St. John was the youngest of the apostles. He and His brother James had been followers of John the Baptist. One day Jesus saw John and James helping their father, Zebedee, mend their fish nets. He called them and said, "Come, follow Me." and from that moment on, they followed Him. They were very devoted to Jesus that one day they wanted to call down a fire on a town that refused to receive Him. Jesus named them "Sons of thunder."



St. John The Beloved

Their mother Salome asked Jesus to give them a place of honor in heaven, and they said that they could drink of Jesus 'cup of suffering. Jesus did not promise those places of honor, but a special share of His friendship, love and suffering.

John was also called the "beloved disciple", because he loved Jesus much. He was present when Jesus raised Jairus 'daughter, he witnessed the transfiguration on the mountain and the agony in the Garden. At the Last Supper, John was privileged to rest his head upon the heart of the Jesus. His courage and love drew him to the cross at Calvary where Jesus entrusted His mother to John saying, "Women, there is your son John there is your mother."

John preached in Palestine for many years. Later he was taken a prisoner to Rome. When he was ninety years old, he wrote the "Gospel of John" in the New

Are you ready to take a look at **GREECE**?


Greece is located in southern Europe and is a peninsula that projects out into the Mediterranean Sea. It has hundreds of small islands around it but the largest one is called Crete.





The Censer

A censer is a small metal dish used to burn incense in our church.

There are 12 bells.
The bells represent the 12 disciples.

The bowl on the bottom that carries the coal represents St. Mary because St. Mary carried in her womb the Divine Fire.

Also the three chains of the censer remind us with the Holy Trinity (The Father, The Son and The Holy Spirit).





We use the censer in our church during services like the Vespers and the Liturgy. You notice that when Abouna is going around the church with the censer, the incense goes up into the air and evaporates. That symbolizes our prayers going up to heaven to God.

Thats' why when Abouna is going around the church, we

should pray so our prayers will go up to God like the incense as king David said in one of the psalms "Let my prayer rise like incense before you, The lifting up of my hands like the evening sacrifice."

Did you know?

Theotokos is the Greek word meaning "Mother of God" Theotokia is the Greek word meaning glorification for the mother of God.









The first to draw a picture of the Virgin was St. Luke. He was a doctor and a painter. He wrote the Gospel of St. Luke and the Acts of the Apostles.

There are 3 large stars on the Virgin's veil, one on the right shoulder, the next on the head, and the third on the left shoulder. These signify that the Virgin Mary is a virgin before, during and after the birth of the child Jesus.







In the icons of St. Mary, there are stars, angels, and clouds around her because she is the second Heaven.

She has a crown on her head because she is a queen.

St. Mary's life on earth was sixty years.

12 years in the temple,


