





Saint Joseph



Most of what is known about **St Joseph** is contained in the first two chapters of the Holy Gospels of St Matthew and St Luke. Several other passages mention him as the father of the Lord Jesus Christ, and a few refer to him as the carpenter from Nazareth. He was a descendant of the royal line of King David, and his family was from Bethlehem, like King David's family.
