

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



When they got to Ceasara **St Philopater** asked if he could pray. While he was praying the Lord Jesus Christ appeared to him and said, "Peace be with you **St Philopater Mercurius** Your prayers have come to me. You will soon come and receive the everlasting crown of martyrdom." With great joy in his heart he told the soldiers he was ready. So on December 4, 250 A.D. **St Philopater Mercurius** was beheaded and received the everlasting crown of martyrdom.
