


Hi! I'm going to be your guide on a fabulous trip through the Holy Sacraments.




Do you know what they are?

I'll give you a hint on the first Sacrament. It has to do with water.



When we are baptized our "Old Nature" becomes clean and our sin is taken away. We put on a "New Nature"

which is in the Lord Jesus Christ. That is why we wear white after we are baptized. We became clean and new again through baptism. Just the way we were before





Why do you think we should go through all this trouble? Why do we have to be baptized?

Well, first of all, we all have sinned. The Holy Bible says that no one is without sin, even if

he lived only one day. So we all need to become new. Also, the Lord Jesus Christ said that unless a man is born again, he could not see the Kingdom of

Heaven. That means that if we don't get baptized, we can't get into Heaven and live with Him and the all the holy angels and saints.



When we are baptized we are also given the Sacrament of the Holy Chrism or the Holy Maroon Oil.

Without being baptized we can't take the Holy Communion and we can't participate with the Holy Angels

in the Eucharist Divine Liturgy because we are not clean enough to stand in the presence of the Lord.





If you are a boy, your parents wait 40 days after you are born and then take you to Abouna to be baptized. If you are a girl, your parents wait 80 days before they take you to be baptized.



When the right amount of time has passed, your parents take you to church where Abouna prays over the water and through those prayers the water is changed and becomes holy. This is done in a mysterious way through the Holy Spirit. That is what the Sacraments are, an invisible mystery performed by the Holy Spirit.

We can't see with our eyes what the Holy Spirit does but we know by faith that the Holy Spirit changes the ordinary, like plain water, to the extraordinary, water that cleans the soul from our original sin. This would not happen unless there are special prayers over the water.

Did you know that our Lord and Savior

Jesus Christ was baptized when he was
living with us on the earth 2,000 years ago?

He was baptized by St. John the

Baptist. He was baptized to show us
how important it is to be baptized
because as He said, 'Unless a man is
baptized by the water and the Spirit
he can not enter the Kingdom of
Heaven.'
