The people attending the court got very mad at him, and they became very angry, yet St Stephen, with a calm voice and sweet smile of a young boy, looked up and said, "I see the




Heavens open, and the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of the Father."

St Stephen knelt on his knees, and cried out joyfully, "Lord Jesus Christ receive my soul.... Lord do not charge them with this sin, forgive them." (The Holy Book of Acts 7)



The Great Change

After the martyrdom of St Stephen, Saul was in great amazement and confusion. He saw St Stephen's face shining like an angel, and heard him saying that the Heaven was open... and in great love he asked forgiveness to those who killed him!

In the mean time, he was convinced that St Stephen's teachings were not the same as the Law of Moses... In his view such teachings might not be from God!

Saul despised the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and his followers who were increasing everyay. Therefore, he



put an end to this matter in his heart. He entered the followers' houses and dragged both men and women out and put them in prison. But in spite of all that, the followers of the Lord Jesus Christ kept on preaching that He was Christ, the Savior of the world.
