Every year just prior to the Feast of the Glorious Resurrection, we relive the Holiest of all weeks, the **Holy Week**, also known as the **Holy Pascha Week**.

The word "pascha" means "Passover." It reminds us of the escape of the Israelites from Egyptian bondage and the sparing of their firstborn when the destroying angel killed the firstborn of the Egyptians. "It is the Passover sacrifice to the Lord, for He passed over the houses of the Israelites in Egypt, when He struck down the Egyptians" (Exodus 12:27).



The celebration of Passover requires a lamb to be sacrificed. It is during this Holy Week that we witness this lamb being our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for our sins. "*Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!*" (John 1:29).


