



## Coptic Lesson 2: Coptic Letters Similar to English Letters

In Lesson one, we learned the letters that look and sound like English letters.

Now let us learn a few more Coptic Letters. Below is the shape of the letter (in Caps and small), its name, and its pronunciation.

Note: not all pronunciation rules will be included, just the basic ones, to avoid confusion.

Ghamma	7.2	Gh	O <b>gh</b> nia (Arabic: Song)
		NG	A <b>ng</b> el

Ghamma is normally pronounced G as in  $\mathfrak{A}$   $\mathsf{Floc}$  (A-gios = Holy, It is pronounced GH as in  $\mathsf{SabpihA}$ (Ghav-riel = Gabiel) (arabic letter Ghen) if followed by any of the vowels: 6.1.H. It is pronounced NG as in  $\lambda \zeta \zeta \epsilon \lambda oc$  (Angelos = Angel)

If there are two consecutive 5 the first is pronounced N, and the second is G.

Delta is normally pronounced ZTH as in  $\Delta \omega pon$  (Ztho-roon = gift) It is pronounced D only if it's a person's name as in Aria (Da-Veed = David)

Horee	sS	Н	<i>H</i> ouse
Jenja (Ganga)	<b>Y</b>	$\boldsymbol{G}$	Go

Jenja is normally pronounced G as in  $\mathfrak{A}_{\times \Pi}(Agp = hour)$ 

It is pronounced J as in  $\mathfrak{X}_{\epsilon}$  (Je = For), if followed by any of the vowels:  $\epsilon.l.H$
