What gift: the gifts of Gold, Frankincense, and Myrrh.

Gold: as a symbol of our purity. Purity of thoughts, body and emotions

Frankincense: as a symbol of our readiness to serve Him, our true spiritual prayers & praises and our life long commitment to our faith through the church sacramental life.

Myrrh: as a symbol of bearing our cross throughout our life facing and overcoming all the trials and the temptations of the devil.
