



## THE ANTICHRIST

The specific name “Antichrist” appears in the Holy Bible only in the first two Holy Letters of St. John. The specific name “Antichrist” does not appear in the Holy Book of Revelation or in the Holy Book of Daniel, or in any other particular place in the Holy Bible.

### **There are two kinds of “Antichrists” mentioned in the Holy Bible:**

1. The one of the Holy Letters of St. John
2. The one at the end of times, who will reign for 3 ½ years, the same time as the ministry of the Lord Jesus Christ.

1. The Antichrist of the Holy Letters of St. John are mentioned five times (twice in I John 2:18, once in I John 2:22, 4:3, and II John 7).

2. The Antichrist of the end of the world.

The term “antichrist” of the Holy Letters of St John has been applied in the Christian literature to the one coming at the end of times, “at the last hour.” (I John 2:18)

### **The following are references to the antichristian might of the world during the last times:**

1. The “Beast” and “the False Prophet” of the Holy Book of Revelations 13 and 16:13 who will reign for 3 ½ years plus 3 ½ years (Revelations 13:5, 12:6, 12:14, 11:3). And the “Woman sitting on a Scarlet Beast” of Revelation 17:3, Babylon the Great, mother of all prostitutes (17:5).



2. The “Little Horn” of the Holy Book of Daniel 7:8,11,8:9, who will reign for 2,300 days, 7 years (8:9-14), during the time of Abomination of Desolation and the Great Tribulation. In 12:11-12 the prophet Daniel specifies the times: The time of Abomination of Desolation will be 1,290 days (3 ½ years), and afterwards another 1,290 days of the Great Tribulation, and blessed are those who persevere for 1,335 days! Refer to the Holy Book of Daniel 7:8-11, 21-26, 8:9-12, and 23-25. Note that the Time of Coming, “Little Horn” is referring to the lowly political origin of the Antichrist and describes him as he is before he attains governmental supremacy. The great prophet Daniel also describes the Antichrist as “the Prince that shall come, shall destroy the city and the sanctuary. (Daniel 9:26)” King Antioch IV, the Assyrian, is the type of Antichrist in the Holy Book of Daniel, the “Little Horn” of chapters 7,8, and 11:21.

3. The Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Gospel of St. Matthew describes the two struggles provoked by the Antichrist: The Abomination of Desolation of Matthew 24:15, for 3 ½ years, and next the Great Tribulation of



the Matthew 24:21 for another 3 ½ years...and gives a precise order of the events of the end of the world in chapters 24 and 25, in the Sermon of Jesus of the End of the World. The time and the work of the Antichrist are evident here.

4. St. Paul in the Holy Book of II Thessalonians gives derogatory, important, and revealing titles to the Antichrist: The Man of Sin, the Son of Perdition, the Wicked One, the Lawless One... and he is already at work today but not of full strength until the restrainer is gone (II Thessalonians 2: 3,8,9).

5. The Holy Book of Psalms give the Antichrist several titles: The Bloody and Deceitful One, the Arrogant (5:6), the Wicked One (10: 2, 4), the Mighty One (52:1), the Enemy (53:3), the Adversary (74:8-10), and the Head of Many Countries (140:1).

6. The holy prophets also mentioned the Antichrist several descriptive times:

Isaiah:

The Assyrian, the “Rod” of God’s anger (Isaiah 10:5, 12).

The King of Babylon (Isaiah 14: 4, 11-20, Jeremiah 49:51).

The Spoiler (Isaiah 16: 4-5).

The Nail (Isaiah 22:25).

Jeremiah:

“the Destroyer of the Gentiles” (4:7).

The “Enemy,” the “Cruel One”.

“the Wicked”(30:14 and 23)

Ezekiel:

The “Profane Wicked Prince of Israel” (21:25).

“Prince of Tyre” (28:2-10).

“the Chief Prince of Meshech and Tubal” (38:2)

Daniel

Has been previously detailed.

Hosea:

“King of Princes” (8:10).

“merchant in whose hand are the balances of deceit”

Who “loves to oppose.” (12:7)

Joel:

“Head of the Northern Army, who shall be overthrown because he magnified himself to do great things.” (2:20)

Amos:

“the Adversary who shall break Israel’s strength and spoil her palaces.” (3:11)

Nahum:

Tells of “Belial’s destruction” (1:15)

Habakkuk:

“the proud man who enlarged his desires as hell and is as death and cannot be satisfied, but gathered unto him all nations and heaped unto him all peoples.” (2:5)

Zechariah:

“the Idol Shepherd” upon who is pronounced God’s woe and upon who descends His judgment.” (11:17)
