

COPTIC LESSON 4: The Last Five Letters

In lesson one, we learned the letters that look and sound like English letters:

a B e z i k w n o c t w

We also learned three letters that look like English letters but are pronounced differently: HPX

In lesson two, we learned Seven New Coptic Letters: $\nabla \lambda \pi \otimes \Sigma \omega$

In lesson three, we learned Five New Coptic Letters: • • • • • • •

Now let us learn the last five Coptic letters. Below is the shape of the letter (in Caps and small), its name, and its pronunciation

Note: not all pronunciation rules will be included, just the basic ones, to avoid confusion.
