# What is Science?

- "Science deals only with the <u>natural</u>, with things that can be apprehended by the <u>sense organs</u>. Science deals with those things that can be <u>measured</u>"
- Science in all of its operations, whether physics, chemistry, or biology, operates within a <u>naturalistic framework</u>.


Dr Rodney Holder. He has a Ph.D. in Astrophysics from Cambridge and Oxford Universities

That year, he was also made a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

# Science & Atheism


- "Has anyone provided a proof of God's inexistence? Not even close. Has quantum cosmology explained the emergence of the universe or why it is here? Not even close.
- Have the sciences explained why our universe seems to be fine-tuned to allow for the existence of life? Not even close.
- Are physicists and biologists willing to believe in anything so long as it is not religious thought? Close enough.
- Has rationalism in moral thought provided us with an understanding of what is good, what is right, and what is moral? Not close enough.
- Has secularism in the terrible twentieth century been a force for good? Not even close to being close.
- Is there a narrow and oppressive orthodoxy of thought and opinion within the sciences? Close enough.
- Does anything in the sciences or in their philosophy justify the claim that religious belief is irrational? Not even in the ballpark.
- Is scientific atheism a frivolous exercise in intellectual contempt? Dead on."

# Has Science Disproved The Existence of God?

- Science cannot prove the nonexistence of anything.
- Why? It requires omniscience.



- In January 2005, The Oxford atheist and Darwinian scientist, Richard Dawkins, was publicly asked what he believed to be true but could not prove. This was an interesting question because he is on record as saying that you should not believe anything without evidence. Now he concedes:
- I believe, but I cannot prove, that all life, all intelligence, all creativity and all design anywhere in the universe is the direct or indirect product of Darwinian natural selection.



"I seem to find this basic notion discovered 2000 or 3000 years ago, and enunciated first in the Western world by the ancient Hebrews: namely that the universe is governed by a single God. This monotheistic view seem to be the historical foundation for modern science."




Melvin Calvin Nobel Prize-winning biochemist Awarded the National Medal of Science (1989)

"A great deal of knowledge was gathered by observation and by trial and error in all ancient cultures, but this is not science. Aristotle, for example, observed widely and theorized extensively, but he did not test his theories against his observations so he was not a scientist. Alchemy and astrology were highly developed in China, Egypt, India and ancient Greece and Rome, but only in medieval Europe did these become the sciences of chemistry, physics and astronomy. 'It is the consensus among contemporary historians, philosophers and sociologists of science that real science arose only once: in Europe.' The leading scientific figures in the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries were overwhelmingly devout Christians who believed it their duty to comprehend God's handiwork" (For the Glory of God, pp. 123, 126–127).








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# The Verdict


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
