INTRODUCTION

This epistle was written by St. Paul to his disciple to Timothy between the years 62-66 AD. Timothy was very dear to St. Paul, who considered him a son and was the key person in Timothy's conversion. Timothy was the bishop of the church in Ephesus, a major city in Asia Minor and the home of the temple of the pagan fertility goddess Diana (Artemis). Although the Ephesian church had a strong leader, it was not impervious to false doctrine, which St. Paul exhorts Timothy to uproot, giving him apostolic authority to do so. This epistle also lays the foundation for church administration and organization.
