An Invitation from God: The Joyous Nativity Feast

My Beloved Children:

I wish you a very blessed and joyful Nativity Feast, confident with jubilation in the birth of the King of kings and Lord of lords, and always assured that you are beloved children of God. On this glorious night, we celebrate the awesome Nativity Feast in which the world has been invited to eternal life. A host of angels invited the lowly shepherds to the obscure place where our King lay. This is our Savior who came to rescue us.
