Your vote counts. It is a way to express your voice in stating the direction in which you feel the nation would most benefit. Influential decision makers, such as senators, congressmen, state representatives, and especially the president, are elected by voters who feel that the morals, values, and political agenda of these candidates are similar to their own. Familiarize yourself with the issues and study the underlying principles of their short term and long term proposals. It is important to know who the officials are in your district. If and when concerns arise, you may thoughtfully add your voice to the discussion or send a courteous letter expressing the point of view you wish to convey. Most importantly, add all concerns and the guidance of the elected officials to your prayers, so that God may grant wisdom to a moral and just society.
