## The Family:

- a) He has good relations with his parents; "Honor thy father and mother."
- b) He respects his older siblings and learns from their experience.
- c) He is kind with his younger siblings and serves them.
- d) He holds married life sacred and is united with his wife spiritually.
- e) He endeavors to give his children a Christian upbringing within the Church.
- f) He respects the humanity of those who work for the family.

## In Church:

- a) He knows that he should be an active member.
- b) He knows that he needs the other members.
- c) He works in all humility, without jealousy or envy, without disputes or conflicts, preserving the peace and promoting the welfare of the ministry.
- d) He understands the concept of the One Body and is quick to serve others.
- e) He knows how important order and discipline are and so behaves with the clergymen and those responsible in all love, humility, and gentleness.
- f) He is aware of human frailty and so judges no one but himself.
- g) He knows the value of constructive criticism and accepts/offers it with love, gentleness, and humility.
- h) He knows that judging others is a noxious wind that blows away all fruits.
- i) Schism is a great undertaking, for the welfare of Satan.

## In Society:

- a) He knows that he is part of the fabric of the country of residence. We may be a minority; being a numerical minority does not negate our ethnic origin.
- b) He knows that he is a witness to the Lord Jesus Christ in society. That is why he presents a faithful Christian model, spreading love and doing good.
- c) He is the light of the world, the salt of the earth, and an ambassador of the Lord Jesus Christ.
- d) He is not a fanatic, for his mind is enlightened with the Spirit of God and the words of the Holy Gospel.
- e) He is not sectarian for he knows that it is one of the most powerful tools for the destruction of the homeland.
- f) He rejects violence, for it is a means of expression that the God of love does not accept.
- g) He contributes his opinion, his efforts, and his work to the building of the country.
- h) He has the feeling of belonging, giving before taking.
- i) He makes sure that he has a voice in the building of national unity.
