GCD History and Progress

† On October 20, 2018, Nader Anise presented the idea of Global Coptic Day to His Grace Bishop Youssef, Bishop of the Southern United States.

It was approved and enthusiastically endorsed by His Grace, so much so that Nader was in Egypt exactly one month later, presenting the idea to bishops of the Holy Synod, and even to His Holiness Pope Tawadros II himself at the St. Bishoy Monastery in Wadi El Natroun.

† After spending a full hour with the honored bishops and an additional ten minutes privately with His Holiness Pope Tawadros, the idea received resounding approval by all parties and *Global Coptic Day was born*.




† While His Grace Bishop Youssef and Nader Anise were in Egypt, they presented His Holiness Pope Tawadros with an icon of the Holy Family's Flight to Egypt, symbolic of Global Coptic Day. The icon was created by the prominent iconographer Osama Moris and presented to His Holiness on November 25, 2018.
